Cost Of Living Grant

Following discussion at the Board of Trustees meeting at the end of the November a new Cost of Living Support Fund was agreed. This fund replaces the Emergency Grant with immediate effect.

The Cost of Living Support Fund is a one-off payment of up to £350 to help with household bills and food shopping costs and is available to people living with MND once in a 12 month rolling period. The fund is due to be reviewed at the end of March 2023 and is available now.
