The cost of living with MND



THROUGH ROOF

As we enter Autumn and Winter fast approaches, the Motor Neurone Disease Association has been looking at how this time of year can put an extra burden on homes living with MND.

After extensive research and publishing a recent report, the MNDA found the cost of living crisis is not over and people living with the illness are still disproportionately affected. This has resulted in many people having to make difficult and impossible choices between fundamental living expenses and maintaining their own health and well-being.

Due to these findings the Association has set up or extended financial help and this month we are focusing on two of those aids that may be able to provide extra support to people living with MND in our region ...

QUALITY OF LIFE GRANT

The Motor Neurone Disease Association's 'Quality of Life' Grant is for equipment and or services that would help to improve the quality of life of a person with MND.

Stretching to up to £500, people living with the disease are able to apply to cover the cost of valuable, beneficial and needed facilities or practices that may not be possible to afford in times of hardship.

THROUGH THE ROOF CAMPAIGN

As the popular phrase goes 'energy prices are through the roof' – but no home feels that more than one with someone living with MND.

Significant rises in household bills means that anyone using or needing equipment that is plugged in, turned on and constantly in use – are once again excessively and unreasonably charged.

The Government had promised to consult on proposals for more targeted energy support – such as the Energy Social Tariff – throughout 2022 and 2023. But this has still not happened. MNDA are asking the UK Government not to renege on their promise and to urgently publish the consultation.

Our community needs Parliament to understand our struggle so please help by writing to your MP to discuss and implement more targeted support for MND households.
