some wonderful and inspiring people, including the people who run the group. One day, out of the blue, I received an invitation to do the extra mile with Kevin Sinfield in Hull. Michelle had very kindly put my name forward. I felt very honoured. Having been a lifelong supporter of Leeds Rhinos, (my grandad used to take me to watch Leeds when I



was a young boy) I naturally accepted the invitation.

We were loaned a racing wheelchair, and, on the 5th December, we went to the Costello Stadium in Hull. The weather was kind to us

- chilly but dry. It was a very well supported event, including children from a local school and there were lots of runners, so Kevin arrived to lots of noise and clapping. He chatted with people in wheelchairs who were taking part. The mile consisted of four laps of the track. My son Matthew and nephew Arran took it in turns to push me round. It was an experience I will never forget. It was a real family affair as most of my family came to support us and cheered us on every time we completed a lap. It was up there as one of the best days of my life, emotional but fabulous and wonderful memories were made.

Hi, I'm Cath and I am a campaigner for the MND Association. The reason I campaign is that I cared for my dad, who had ALS, and felt the frustration at the care and services he sometimes received. People didn't have awareness about the disease and didn't

understand how quickly it could progress.

After emailing my local MP, he invited me to talk to him about MND and the issues and problems we encountered. After this I was asked to join the campaign team which involves updating myself on the MND national and local campaigns, sending emails to local MPs and counsellors and sharing news and campaigns on social media.

Attending the West Yorkshire Branch monthly 'get togethers', helps me gain a better understanding of the issues people living with MND and their families are having now. For example, some people were having problems booking wheelchair taxis so we invited Leeds city council taxi enforcement officers to attend our get togethers so we could explain to them about some of our concerns.

MND is such a cruel disease, I hope that, in some small way I can help and support people by helping to raise awareness. I hope that other people might read this and feel like they could join us.

ARE YOU AN UNPAID CARER THINKING ABOUT TAKING A BREAK?



Carefree is an organisation offering low-cost hotel stays across the UK for unpaid carers. These breaks help carers recharge and manage their caring responsibilities more effectively. To apply, simply sign up on the Carefree website and provide details about yourself and the person you care for. You will need to submit proof of your caring status, either by uploading a document or nominating a professional referee. Once approved, you'll gain access to Carefree's booking portal, where you can browse and request a hotel stay. Each break costs £33 and includes up to two nights' accommodation (often with breakfast included!). To sign up, visit their 'take a break' page. Article from Leeds Carers.
